Russia Orphanage Ministry Background

Many children in this vast and complex country are "social orphans." While some have lost parents to death, many have been orphaned because of alcohol abuse, economic, or other social factors. In many areas of Russian society, the word "orphan" is often synonymous with "worthless."

Life in an institution has left them completely unprepared to manage simple tasks of life – or make good choices about relationships, who to trust, or how to spend their time. No guidance and no accountability mean no compass. Orphaned girls are especially vulnerable to prostitution and sex trafficking.

Over the past decade, Capo Beach Calvary has partnered with three specific orphanages in the Kostroma region. These orphanages have become virtual extensions of our own church as our members have directly sponsored hundreds of these orphans. As a community, we not only engage with these orphanages through sponsorship but also through trips which give us the opportunity to be physical reminders to the children that there is an entire church body who loves them, prays for them and has a vested interest in their lives.

Trip Overview

Our focus on this trip has been and always will be the children whom God has put under our care. We will travel long distances, battle fatigue, deal with each others issues, eat bland food, and sleep on less than ideal mattresses all for the sake of being representatives and reminders of Christ's love for these children. At each of the three orphanages we take full advantage of the time we have. We balance our time between unstructured hang-out time with the children, planned games and crafts, organized birthday parties, and sometimes skits and performances. In everything we do with the children, whether playing games, painting faces, giving manicures, touring their rooms, celebrating birthdays, sharing stories, discussing the bible, or walking to the market, we remind ourselves that we may in fact be their only visitor that year and thus even our smallest acts of kindness speak volumes to their self esteem and their understanding of a God who loves them.

Steps To Sign Up

- After seeking the Lord about your decision to join us in Russia and making your final decision, follow this checklist in order to ensure that you are signed up and on track.
- Fill out the "Short-Term Application" and turn it into the church office with a \$250 deposit check or online deposit payment (see payment methods below). If you are a returning traveler and your information has not change there is no need to fill out the application again.
- You will then be contacted by Jesse or Craig with any follow up questions or concerns. Once approved, you're part of the team.
- Purchase your plane ticket (see below).
- Turn in your passport and 1 passport photo (see instructions)
- Submit your visa application online (see instructions)
- When instructed, print, sign and turn in your visa application to Jesse.
- Attend team meetings (2-3 meetings TBD before we travel)

Flight Details

Over the years we've learned that purchasing group tickets for this specific trip is not the best choice. So each traveler will need to purchase their own ticket. Please match the itinerary below so that you will be traveling with our group. If for some reason you must leave from a different airport or at a different time, contact me prior to purchasing your tickets. I've found the best way to book tickets on Aeroflot airlines is through a site such as priceline.com or travelocity.com rather than directly on Aeroflot's website.

Ground Fees and Payments

Due to the constant fluctuation of transportation and hotel costs we are only provided with an estimated ground fee from Children's Hopechest. The final amount will be confirmed as we approach the trip date.

Right now the estimation is about **\$1780** which includes all ground transportation, food, lodging, translator/staff fees, and visa processing fees. You will only be responsible for airport food while traveling and personal souvenirs.

Payments

An initial deposit of \$250 is required to secure your spot on the trip.

A second deposit of \$250 is due by March 4th.

Final payment of the remaining balance is due April 8th.

Methods of payments

Check: must have "Russia Trip - *your name*" in the memo. Turn into the church office any time.

Credit Card: either in person in the church office or online at capobeachcalvary.com/online. Login using your username then click on "registrations". Find "Russia Trip 2012" and click "register".

Sponsorship From Others

Other individuals or companies may donate towards this trip and receive a tax deduction. If the donor requires a receipt, they or yourself must contact our accounting department to arrange that. Any donation from another person must have "Russia Trip - *your name*" in the memo. In the event you are unable to go on the trip these funds must be used for general costs for this specific trip and can not be transferred, refunded or held for future trips.

Cancelations

Trips will be confirmed upon receipt of this signed agreement and your initial deposit. Children's HopeChest prefers for cancellation notices to be received in writing and signed by the trip leader. Children's HopeChest understands the changing nature of today's world. As a result, we have adopted the following cancellation policy for your team as a whole. Initial deposits are nonrefundable. If your group or an individual team member should cancel:

11 or more weeks from trip date: 100% refund minus expenses already paid

6-10 weeks from trip date: 50% refund minus initial deposit.

0-5 weeks from trip date: No refund guaranteed. CHC reserves the right to evaluate each cancellation on an individual basis.

Funds from cancelled team trips may be applied to future trips for up to one year. The amount to be applied will be the total cost of the trip, minus the non-refundable deposit and any costs already incurred from visa processing and reservations overseas.



PASSPORTS & VISA APPLICATION CHECKLIST

(Required for travel to Russia)

Note: EACH TRAVELER SHOULD RECIEVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS.

- **CHILDREN'S HOPECHEST MUST HAVE YOUR PASSPORT IN ORDER TO GET THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTATION FOR TRAVEL IN RUSSIA.**

Please check the following BEFORE sending us your passport! Thank you!

- **IS IT SIGNED?**
 - We will have to send your passport back to you to sign, as it is invalid without a signature.
- **DOES IT HAVE VALID DATES?**
 - Passport must be valid within 6 months of your travel time. In other words, the **“Date of Expiration”** needs to be at least six months after your return date. This is imperative, as you will not be issued a Letter of Invitation or visa if your passport expires within six months of your travel dates.
- **DOES IT HAVE BLANK “VISA” PAGES?**
 - There must be one COMPLETELY blank page in your passport for your Russian visa. If you do not have blank pages available, you will need to send your passport in for additional pages to be added. **This does not include the “Addendum Pages” in the back of your passport.** *(Please note that if a page has any kind of leaked ink from stamps, etc. on it, it is considered unusable.)*

- **OBTAINING ADDITIONAL VISA PAGES**

If you require additional visa pages in your passport, please visit: <http://travel.state.gov>. **Please do this immediately.**

- **DO YOU HAVE AN OFFICIAL PASSPORT/VISA PHOTO?**

- **IMPORTANT:** *The guidelines for your visa application photo are VERY specific. Please follow the guidelines listed below when obtaining your official photos:*
 - *No smiling*
 - *No frowning*
 - *Do not show any teeth in photo*
 - *No sunglasses (prescription glasses only)*
 - *No photos six months or older*

Following these guidelines will help to ensure that you will be able to obtain a Russian visa.

- **IS THE VISA APPLICATION FILLED OUT CORRECTLY?**

- **IMPORTANT – As of JULY 1, 2011, the Russian Embassy is requiring that ALL visa applications must be filled out online. Visa applications must be filled out at <http://evisa.kdmid.ru/> .**
- Please read all instructions for the Russian Visa Application. (See attached instructions.)

- **PLEASE NOTE:**

- While Children's HopeChest understands that there are many unavoidable situations, failure to miss any of the above items can result in your Russian visa being delayed or **NOT** approved in time for your trip. Children's HopeChest will not be held responsible for a Russian visa not being approved due to any of the above items being omitted.
- **IF YOU HAVE ANY MEMBERS OF YOUR TEAM WHO ARE 14 OR YOUNGER, IT IS REQUIRED THAT WE HAVE A COPY OF HIS/HER BIRTH CERTIFICATE.** If we do not have this, we will be unable to obtain a Letter of Invitation or Russian visa.
- **IF A TRAVELER NEEDS HIS/HER PASSPORT DURING THE TIME WE NEED IT:**
 - Due to the lengthy processing time for a Russian visa, we require our traveler's passports in advance. We understand travelers may also need to travel on their passport for personal trips elsewhere during the time we would need it. We do not want any of our travelers to be inconvenienced during this time. Therefore, we will provide you with guidelines on how this should be handled. Should you have any questions about this, please contact your Partner Relations Coordinator.

1) If you need to travel with your passport 12 weeks to 5 weeks prior to your Russia trip, it is essential that you or your trip leader inform Children's HopeChest **one week before** your passport is needed. In addition, your Partner Relations Coordinator **MUST** know your travel dates, as we must plan when we will receive your passport back in our office. We ask that your passport is still sent in to our office with your initial paperwork so that we can scan and review the passport. This ensures that we have all the information needed in order to process your visa.

Once the traveler has returned from their trip, we ask that the passport is sent via **FedEx/UPS** back to our office as soon as possible so we may continue to move forward with the visa process.

2) The final steps in obtaining a Russian visa takes place five to two weeks prior to the trip. We must have all passports in our office five weeks prior to your trip departure. This is a necessary step, as it ensures that we have enough time to get your visa processed at the Russian Embassy in Washington D.C. If we receive passports back later than five weeks prior to departure, there could be additional costs incurred, and we risk not getting the visa back in time.



Visa Application Instructions

The Visa application process is probably the most tedious and time-consuming document you will fill out. Here at Children's HopeChest, we take great care to ensure your application is filled out correctly before it is sent to the Russian Embassy for them to meticulously scrutinize. Please note that with the new online visa application, if there is missing information and/or blanks, you will not be allowed to continue in the application process. The embassy is very strict and it is of the utmost importance that you fill out your visa application correctly and in its entirety. We ask that you have "concentrated, undisturbed" time to fill out your application. THANK YOU in advance for taking the time to fill out this application correctly!

○ **PLEASE FOLLOW THESE IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS:**

- As of July 1, 2011 ALL visa applications must be filled out online at <http://evisa.kdmid.ru/> . We have asked your trip leader to follow the directions indicated at this site to receive a 'Declarant ID' and password. The entire team will utilize this ID and password, and will save their applications so that the entire team's applications can be found in the same place. The trip leader will also share this ID and password with your trip planner at CHC so that s/he can fill in certain important information. **(Note: Trip leaders, please print off a copy of your ID and password when it appears on the screen, as it tends to be quite complicated!)**
- White out can no longer be used to edit a visa application that has been printed and signed. If there is an error on the application, you must re-enter your account, correct the error, print the application again, and resign the corrected copy.
- Every question must be answered in its entirety.
 - This includes **ALL phone numbers and address**, especially for employment, colleges, and schools.
- If a question does not apply to you, please put 'N/A' in the appropriate space. It is important that no section is left completely blank – with the new process, this is made very clear, as the system will not allow you to move forward if key information is missing.
- PLEASE NOTE: **Do not print your visa application to send to CHC until your trip leader has notified you that your CHC trip planner has entered specific information on your application. The specific 'travel dates' and specific Letter of Invitation number will not be assigned until later in the planning process.** These items must be in the completed document before it is printed and signed, or you will have to add them, reprint them, and sign the document.
 - There is a special barcode on each visa application that makes it necessary for you to print the document and sign it.
 - In the old application, the Letter of Invitation number was not necessary, and your PRC could fill in the appropriate dates. (CHC adds a small buffer to the dates requested for your visa in case there are any unplanned delays, emergencies, etc. It is very important that the dates on your visa application reflect the dates shown on your Letter of Invitation, and NOT your actual travel dates.)
 - It is very important that once you receive confirmation from your trip leader that your 'dates of travel' and Letter of Invitation number have been filled out that you print your application **AS SOON AS POSSIBLE**. From there, you will need to sign it and give it to your trip leader so that all of the team's completed visa applications can be sent to CHC very quickly. We are often up against very short deadlines once we receive your Letter of Invitation, so this is of the utmost importance.

Tip: Please keep a copy of the declarant ID and password. Once you have received a declarant ID and password, you may login to the website and edit your application with new information each year, rather than filling out the entire application every time. **Once you are logged in to the system, you will need to click on 'My Applications' in the upper right hand corner to access your saved visa application.**

Below you will find a detailed explanation of how to answer each question on the online application. Please utilize these instructions, as it will assist you as you complete the application.

These instructions appear in the same order and grammatical language as they do when you are filling out the application online.

- **Purpose of visit**
 - For the first question select 'cultural' visits, then 'humanitarian' and for the third question 'common humanitarian' will be your only option.
- **For number of entries choose 'Single.'**
- **For 'Date of Entry' and "Date of Departure"** enter actual dates of travel.
- **For the surname**
 - Enter your last name. For patronymic enter your middle name (do not leave blank unless you do not have a middle name on your passport! They have gotten really picky about this)
- **For the question asking 'Type of passport'**
 - Select tourist
- **For 'Passport issued by'** enter the information listed in the right corner of your passport under "Issued by."
 - For example 'US Department of State'
- **Leave the directive number blank**
- **For right now ONLY, leave the number of invitation blank.**
 - The PRC will send this number to the trip leader as soon as the letters of invitation are received in the office. Once you receive the number, enter as soon as possible, print, sign and give to your trip leader immediately!
- **'Name of organization to be visited'**
 - Enter "Fund Nadezhda."
- **'City of organization to be visited'**
 - Enter Vladimir.
- **'Routes of journey (points of destination)'**
 - Enter all cities or towns and regions you will be visiting. For example, Moscow, Vladimir, Lukhtanovo, OR Moscow, Kirov, Slobodskoye. (*Note: when you enter a city, you must click the '+' in order for it to be in the correct text box.)
- **For your home address and work information**
 - Enter your FULL address with city, zip code, fax number (if applicable) etc.
- **'Do you have a medical insurance policy in Russia'**
 - Choose 'yes' – you will be covered under Global Underwriters Policy # US022423
- **'Who will pay for your trip and stay in Russia'**
 - Enter Children's HopeChest.
- **'Marital Status'**
 - Choose the appropriate answer. Once you have chosen, more applicable questions related to your spouse's information will appear. Be sure to fill in all information!
- **'List all countries you have visited in the last 10 years and year of visit'**
 - Select year and country in the drop down box. Then click "add" to enter in the text box. If you have visited a country more than once, you will only have to enter it once, and choose the year of your last visit.
- **'Did the other countries give out the passports to you'**
 - Click 'yes' and choose USA (if you are traveling on a US passport).

- **'Where you worked in the other place'**

- List the last place you worked before your current location/employer. You will enter your last TWO places of employment before the current one.
- **'Whether you received education in higher education establishment'**
 - List the name of university or college you attended, the years of attendance and the full address.
- **"List all charity organizations to which you are a part"**
 - If there is nothing to list, enter "N/A."
- **'Where you plan to stay in Russia'**
 - Enter "Ismailova Hotel, Izmailovskoye Highway, 71 Moscow 105187." You may leave the phone number blank.
- **"Have you ever received a visa?"**
 - Enter yes. From there you will be asked "where" and "when."
 - Enter "Washington D.C." because we use the consulate there. For 'when' enter the date the visa was issued. You will find this on your former visa in your passport.
- **There is a "notes" box at the end of the application, leave this blank.**
- **'Appointment date'**
 - Enter the date you are filling out the application.
- **'Visa appointment location'**
 - Select United States.
- **'Visa issuing office'**
 - Select Washington.

At the end click "save and send".

**Kidnapping and Hostage Taking of
Children's HopeChest Employees and Volunteers**

International acts of terrorism, violence and kidnapping are a tragic part of current reality. As Children's HopeChest grows and touches the lives of more people in a variety of countries, it is always possible that Children's HopeChest employees or volunteers may be affected.

We recognize the difficult decisions involved when hostages are taken; however, we believe that governments, organizations, and individuals have a common interest in not giving in to terrorist demands. We strongly believe that concessions, whenever they are made, only encourage further attacks and put additional people at risk. Children's HopeChest is prepared to use every legitimate means to secure the release of any of our employees or volunteers being held hostage.

This form is a bit daunting but we have been advised to have all foreign travelers sign it. Let us begin by saying that we have never felt that we were in any danger of terrorist acts or that anyone traveling with us has ever been at any risk of being kidnapped. When traveling internationally, everyone needs to acknowledge that anything is possible, however unlikely. The purpose of the following policy statement is not to scare you but to establish how Children's HopeChest would deal with acts of terrorism involving its employees or volunteers. Please read, sign and return the following, confirming your understanding of this policy.

Employee / Volunteer Agreement

Children’s HopeChest will make no concessions to terrorists. We will not negotiate for the payment of ransom for the release of hostages or prisoners. Children’s HopeChest will cooperate with the appropriate governmental agencies to insure that all perpetrators of violent acts against its employees / volunteers are brought to justice. All persons in Children’s HopeChest who are / or potentially will be in areas of the world where this is a risk shall sign a document which affirms they have read and understood this policy.

Release and Hold Harmless Agreement

I wish to participate in a Children’s HopeChest short-term trip as specified in this application. In consideration of acceptance for this trip, I, being of legal age, do hereby authorize any necessary medical and/or dental treatment on my behalf/ on behalf of my minor child _____, should I be unable to give such consent. This consent includes reasonable medical and/or dental treatment including but not limited to diagnostic tests, x-rays examinations, anesthesia, or other procedures which may be deemed necessary to my medical well-being / the medical well-being of my minor child for the duration of the trip.

I hereby voluntarily release and hold harmless Children’s HopeChest, its officers, agents, and employees, acting officially or otherwise, from all manner of suits, actions, claims, demands, and liabilities which may arise from my participation / the participation of my minor child in this trip. I authorize the designated leader of the trip to arrange for my / my minor child’s premature return home should this be deemed necessary. I understand that this will be at my own expense should the reason be, as concluded by the leader, my / my minor child’s inability to work together with the team in an appropriate manner.

I recognize that conditions in some of the places to which I / my minor child will travel may not be of the same standard as the conditions to which I am accustomed (i.e., political governments and judicial systems). I further realize that there may be certain health and detainment risks as well as other known and unknown risks to me / my child and I enter / allow my minor child to enter into participation in this trip with knowledge of this.

I understand that this document constitutes a full and complete waiver of all possible claims, including claims of negligence in personal injury or property loss and / or damage, arising out of my participation / the participation of my minor child in this trip. By signing this agreement, I acknowledge that I have read and accept its terms.

I agree that the information provided is true to the best of my knowledge and I understand that by submitting my application I am not insured a spot on a team.

I have read the Kidnapping and Hostage Taking of Children’s HopeChest Employees and Volunteers section of this application, and fully understand that in the event that I am held as hostage or a victim of kidnapping, Children’s HopeChest will use every legitimate means to secure my release but will not make any concessions nor negotiate payment of ransom for my release.
